Jaipur's First Issue, a Provisional Issue

Jaipur's first stamp issue was a provisional issue. Probably in April or May 1904 Jaipur placed an order three values of Jaipur's postage stamps with Perkins Bacon, London. Realizing that it would probably take six months or so before they could receive the engraved stamps from Perkins Bacon, they set about having Jaipur postage stamps locally printed in Jaipur by a cheap and easy lithograph printing process. Like the order to Perkins Bacon, they locally printed ½, 1 and 2 annas Jaipur stamps and issued the stamps on 14 July 1904, a provisional issue for use before the arrival of the three stamp values from Perkins Bacon. The Perkins Bacon stamps did not arrive in Jaipur until December 1904, so the lithographed provisional stamps were exclusively used from 14 July 1904 to December 1904 and continued in use in combination with Perkins Bacon stamps at least until mid-1905.

When J.R.M. Albrecht wrote an in-depth study of Jaipur stamps in 1924 (The Postage Stamps of Jaipur, Stanley Gibbons, Ltd, London 1924, 24 pages), the catalog listing was for three stamps, the $\frac{1}{2}$, 1 and 2 annas. Today there are five main catalog numbers and 11 varieties plus proofs in the issued colors and shades as well as in black

The provisional first issues of Jaipur stamps feature the sun god Surya in a two-wheel chariot drawn by a mounted horse. Although the lithograph provisional issues and engraved Perkins Bacon issues are different in appearance, the sun god Surya image was used for both issues. The three values of the provisional issue were locally printed by lithography with each stamp hand drawn on the lithographic stone. Only one stone is recorded for each of the 1 and 2 annas stamps both listed as stone I.The 1 and 2 annas values and the first $\frac{1}{2}$ anna stone are 12 (4 × 3) hand drawn impressions of the respective stamps. There are three stones recorded for the $\frac{1}{2}$ anna value. Stone I for the $\frac{1}{2}$ anna value has 12 (4 × 3) hand drawn impressions, stones II and III for the $\frac{1}{2}$ anna value have 24 (4 × 6) hand drawn impressions.

Over the years there have been hints of an additional ½ anna stone of 12 hand drawn impressions. In 2014 Alec J. Jeffreys, Ratan Ch. Batia and Gaurav Porwal (India Post, Journal of the India Study Circle of Philately, No. 192, 2014, pages 42 to 44) teamed up to show this "new" stone of the ½ anna stamp is in fact the "original state" of



stone I, designated as stone IA. Most of the $\frac{1}{2}$ anna stone I stamps recoded up to 2014 are the "redrawn state" stamps from stone IB. Stone IB stamps are much more plentiful than stone IA stamps.

Thus, there is not a new stone, but stone IA is the "original state" and stone IB the "redrawn state" and both are stone I of 12 hand drawn impressions. Also, since stone IB stamps were known before stone IA stamps were identified by specialists, stone IB stamps received Gibbons catalog numbers SG 1 pale blue, rough perf 14, SG 1a ultramarine rough perf 14 and SG 1b ultramarine, imperforate. Stone IA stamps received Gibbons catalog numbers SG 1c pale slate-blue, rough perf 14 and SG 1d pale slate blue, imperforate. This is complex but luckily it is fairly easy to distinguish between stone IA stamps (SG 1c and 1d and stone IB stamps, SG 1, 1a and 1b.

To distinguish stone IA from stone IB here are some of the features: 1) stone IA has a thin inner frameline and stone IB a thick inner frameline, 2) stone IA has a noticeable space been the top of the umbrella and the top inner frameline while stone IB has the umbrella touching or almost touching the top inner frameline, except in position R1/1, 3) on stone IA the outer frameline is a rectangle and on stone IB the outer framelines extend to the margins, and 4) stone IA shows a very detailed and clear printing versus stone IB. Printed on white to toned wove paper, no watermark, yellowish-white gum, rough perforated 14 with the whole sheet perforated at one time.

The $\frac{1}{2}$ anna stone II is much less complicated than stone I of the $\frac{1}{2}$ anna, there are three Gibbons catalog numbers for this $\frac{1}{2}$ anna stamp: SG 2 grey-blue, rough perf 14, SG 2a grey-blue, imperforate and SG 3 ultramarine, rough perf 14. Like all impressions on the first issue stamps, stone II of the $\frac{1}{2}$ anna stamp has each stamp impression hand drawn on the lithograph stone and locally printed in Jaipur. Unlike stone IA and IB stone II has 24 (4 × 6) stamps to the printed sheet rather than 12 (4 × 3) stamps. Gibbons lists stone II as Type 1a and its characteristics are as follows: 1) value at sides in large letters and characters, 2) "HALF ANNA" always with a gap between the two words measuring between 14.5 and 15.5 mm, 3) sheets of 24 (4 × 6) with stamps 3 to 4 mm apart, 4) outer frameline around the 24 stamps is a rectangle, no extensions of the outer frameline around the sheet to the edge of the sheets. Printed on medium white to toned paper, no watermark, yellowish-white gum, rough perforated 14 with all 24 stamps perforated in one operation.

Stone III of the $\frac{1}{2}$ anna is a relative common stamp and the easiest to recognize. There are four Gibbons catalog numbers for the stone III $\frac{1}{2}$ anna stamp: SG 3 pale-blue, rough perf 14, SG 3a deep blue, rough perf 14, SG 3b ultramarine, rough perf 14 and SG 3c ultramarine, imperforate. Like stones I and II, each of 24 impressions (4 × 6) of stone III were hand drawn on a lithograph stone, locally printed in Jaipur. Gibbons lists stone III as Type 2 with characteristics: 1) value at sides in large letters and characters, 2) "HALF ANNA" measuring between 16 and 17 mm, 3) both vertical inscriptions start below the inner frame line, 4) sheets of 24 (4 × 6) with stamps 1.5 to 2 mm apart. Printed on medium white to toned paper, no watermark, yellowish-white gum, rough perforated 14 with the whole sheet perforated at one time.

The one anna stamp is relatively simple compared to the $\frac{1}{2}$ anna stamp; it is designated stone I but each of the 12 impressions are also hand drawn so the impressions do not mirror either the $\frac{1}{2}$ anna stone IA or IB impressions. Like the original state of the $\frac{1}{2}$ anna stone IA, the sheet size is 12 (4 × 3), locally printed in Jaipur. Gibbons lists two shades: dull red SG 4 and scarlet SG 4a and classifies both listings as Type 1 with characteristics: 1) value at sides in small letters and characters, 2) "HALF ANNA" in two words except R2/4, and 3) sheets of 12 (4 × 3) with stamps 2 to 2.5 mm apart. Printed on white to toned wove paper, no watermark, yellowish-white gum, rough perforated 14 with the whole sheet perforated at one time. The sheets have an outer frameline that extends to the edges of the sheet. Imperforate ungummed sheet proofs exist in dull red.

The two annas stamp, like the one anna is relatively simple compared to the ½ anna stamps; it is also designated stone I like the one anna stamp. Like the original state of the ½ anna stone IA, the sheet size is 12 (4 x 3) with each stamp hand drawn on a lithograph stone, locally printed in Jaipur. Gibbons lists two shades: pale green SG 5 and emeraldgreen SG 5a and classifies both listings as Type 1 with characteristics: 1) value at sides in small letters and characters, 2) "HALF ANNA" in two words and 3) sheets of 12 (4 x 3) with stamps 2 to 2.5 mm apart. Printed on white to toned wove paper, no watermark, yellowish-white gum, rough perforated 14 with the whole sheet perforated at one time. The sheets have a rectangular color marginal lines around the 12 stamps just like the ½ anna stone IA sheets of 12. The sheets have an outer frameline that extends to the edges of the sheet. Imperforate ungummed sheet proofs exist in emerald.
