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Vorwort · Foreword

„Schönheit ist Geschmackssache und liegt im Auge des Betrachters“, ist ein Satz, der auf die Philatelie der Indischen Staaten wirklich zutrifft. Während Stampboards, das weltweit führende Online-Briefmarkenforum, den Begriff „The Uglies“ („Die Hässlichen“) verwendet, um philatelistische Stücke aus den indischen Staaten zu beschreiben, sehen die meisten, die mit diesem Nischenbereich der Philatelie vertraut sind, die Briefmarken als etwas Schönes und Exotisches an, denn auf ihnen sind sogar Göttinnen und Götter, Könige und Königinnen, Elefanten und Pfauen abgebildet. Andere wiederum sehen in ihnen einige der primitivsten und rudimentärsten Briefmarken überhaupt, die aus Holzblöcken (Bhor, Abb. 1), Gummistempeln (Charkhari, Abb. 2) oder einfach aus einem Stück farbigen Papier (Kotah, Abb. 3) hergestellt und mit einem Nagelbett perforiert wurden (Bhopal, Abb. 4).

Die Briefmarken der Indischen Staaten sind all das und noch viel mehr. Um die unterschiedlichen Facetten und die Magie der Philatelie der indischen

“Beauty is in the eyes of the beholder” is a phrase that can truly be attributed to Indian States philately. While Stampboards, the world’s leading online stamp forum, utilizes the term The Uglies to describe Indian States philatelic items, most that are familiar with this niche area of philately see the stamps as something beautiful and exotic, some even portraying Gods and Goddesses, kings & queens, elephants and peacocks. While, to the other extreme, some see them as some of the most primitive & rudimentary stamps around, having been produced from wood block (Bhor fig. 1), rubber stamp (Charkhari fig. 2) or simply a piece of coloured paper (Kotah fig. 3) to having been perforated using a ‘bed of nails’ (Bhopal fig. 4).

Indian States stamps are all that and more. To understand the various facets and the mystique of Indian States philately one has to delve into the historical background that led to the necessity of issuing stamps and postal stationery by forty Indian Feudatory States and six Indian Convention States.

Bundesstaaten zu verstehen, muss man sich mit den historischen Hintergründen befassen, die dazu führten, dass vierzig indische Feudalstaaten und sechs indische Konventionsstaaten Briefmarken und Ganzsachen herausgaben.

Die Postabkommen

Die königliche Regierung Indiens schloss Postabkommen mit sechs indischen Fürstenstaaten (Chamba, Faridkot, Gwalior, Jhind, Nabha und Patiala). Gemäß des Postabkommens wurden die bestehenden Briefmarken und Ganzsachen von Britisch-Indien mit dem Namen des jeweiligen Staates überdruckt und durften sowohl innerhalb des jeweiligen Staates als auch auf Sendungen an beliebige Ziele in Britisch-Indien verwendet werden. Im philatelistischen Kontext werden diese sechs Staaten als Konventionsstaaten bezeichnet, im Unterschied zu den Feudalstaaten, die kein Postabkommen mit Britisch-Indien hatten. Die Feudalstaaten gaben ihre eigenen Briefmarken und Ganzsachen heraus, deren postalische Gültigkeit innerhalb der Grenzen ihres jeweiligen Staates beschränkt war:

Das Ego einiger Maharadschas war so ausgeprägt, dass sie der Überzeugung waren, wenn das Konterfei der englischen Königin auf Briefmarken verewigt war, dann würde auch Ihnen selbst dies zustehen. Andere gaben Briefmarken ausschließlich zum Nutzen ihrer Untertanen herausgaben, da die königliche Post kein dichtes Netz von Postwegen bot, um abgelegene und isolierte Gebiete zu erreichen.

Ein weiterer interessanter Aspekt ist, dass zwar mehrere Staaten um die Erlaubnis baten, eigene Briefmarken herauszugeben, aber nur wenige von der königlichen Regierung ein solches Privileg erhielten. Dem Amir von Bahawalpur beispielsweise, der zufällig ein leidenschaftlicher Philatelist war, wurde die Genehmigung zur Ausgabe eigener Briefmarken verweigert, während sein Nachbarstaat Las Bela 1897 Briefmarken herausgab. The postal agreements

The Imperial Government of India made postal conventions with six Princely States of India (Chamba, Faridkot, Gwalior, Jhind, Nabha & Patiala). As per the postal convention (or agreement), existing adhesive stamps and postal stationery of British India were overprinted with the name of the State for use within their respective State as well as on mail to any destinations in British India. For philatelic purposes, these 6 States are referred to as Convention States, different from the Feudatory States which had no postal agreement with British India. The Feudatory States issued their own stamps and postal stationery, the postal validity of which were restricted to within the borders of their respective States.

While some Maharajas had pompous egos and believed that if the queen of England could have her portrait on Indian stamps so should they, there were others who issued stamps for the sole benefit of their subjects as the Imperial post did not offer an intricate network of postal routes to cover remote & isolated areas.

Another interesting aspect is that while several States requested permission to issue their own postage stamps, few were granted such permission by the Imperial government. The Amir of Bahawalpur, who happened to be a very passionate philatelist, was denied permission to issue postage stamps while his neighboring State, Las Bela, issued stamps in 1897. And then there were States such as Kotah and Tonk (Fig. 5) that issued their own postage stamps without seeking approval from the Imperial government.

The Imperial government did not enforce a uniform policy when it came to the issuance of postage stamps and postal stationery by individual States.

Also intriguing is the fact that the entire philatelic world was unaware, until the late 1960's, that

es da noch Staaten wie Kotah und Tonk (Abb. 5), die ihre eigenen Briefmarken herausgaben, ohne eine Genehmigung des Königshauses einzuholen.

Die königliche Regierung verfolgte keine einheitliche Politik, wenn es um die Ausgabe von Briefmarken und Ganzsachen durch die einzelnen Staaten ging.

Bemerkenswert ist, dass in der gesamten philatelistischen Welt bis in die späten 1960er Jahre nicht bekannt war, dass Dungarpur, Kotah, Shahpura und Tonk eigene Briefmarken herausgegeben hatten, einige davon sogar bereits im Jahr 1883. Vermutlich wäre die Philatelistengemeinschaft sogar nie auf diese geheimnisvollen Briefmarkenstaaten aufmerksam geworden, wenn nicht ein ungebildeter Papierhändler mit seinen scharfen Augen frankierte Belege aus diesen vier Staaten vor der Entsorgung zu Papierbrei gerettet hätte.

Belege mit Kombinationsfrankaturen

Mit dem Studium der Postgeschichte von Jammu und Kaschmir lässt sich nachweisen, dass es in der Anfangszeit ein Privileg für Weiße gab. Europäer waren die Profiteure des speziellen „Besuchertarifs“, der genau die Hälfte des normalen Posttarifs betrug, den die Einheimischen von Jammu und Kaschmir zahlen mussten. (Abb. 6)

Dungarpur, Kotah, Shahpura and Tonk had even issued postage stamps, some as early as 1883. It can be speculated that the philatelic community would never have known about these mysterious stamp issuing States, had it not been for the keen eyes of an illiterate paper merchant who saved franked covers from these four States from being recycled into paper pulp.

Combination covers

Through the study of the postal history of Jammu & Kashmir it can be proven that white privilege existed in the early days. Europeans were the beneficiaries of the special “Visitor’s Rate” which was exactly half the normal postal rate that natives of Jammu & Kashmir had to pay. (Fig. 6)

Another interesting facet of Indian States philately are “combination” covers. Since stamps and postal stationery from the various Indian Feudatory States had postal validity only within their respective States, mail sent to an addressee outside

Weitere interessante Facetten der Philatelie der indischen Bundesstaaten stellen Briefe mit Kombinationsfrankaturen dar. Da Briefmarken und Ganzsachen aus den verschiedenen indischen Feudalstaaten nur innerhalb ihres jeweiligen Staates gültig waren, mussten Sendungen, die an einen Empfänger außerhalb der Staatsgrenzen oder gar nach Übersee geschickt wurden, zusätzlich zur eigenen Frankierung auch Briefmarken von Britisch-Indien tragen. Die Tatsache, dass Briefmarken aus Staaten wie Dungarpur und Tonk in der Philatelie noch Jahrzehnte nach ihrer Ausgabe unbekannt waren, könnte darauf zurückzuführen sein, dass aus diesen beiden Staaten keine Kombinationsbelege bekannt sind. Folglich wusste die Welt außerhalb der Staatsgrenzen nichts von der Existenz dieser Marken.

Die Philatelie der indischen Staaten bietet einige der größten philatelistischen Raritäten der Welt. Hunderte von seltenen Briefmarken der indischen Staaten, von denen es jeweils weniger als 20 Exemplare gibt, haben typischerweise einen Katalogwert von gerade mal etwa 2000 £. Es verwundert daher nicht, dass die Katalogwerte der Briefmarken der indischen Staaten innerhalb der letzten 20 Jahren jährlich im zweistelligen Prozentbereich gestiegen sind. So stiegen beispielsweise die Katalogwerte aller ungebrauchten Dungarpur-Briefmarken im Stanley-Gibbons-Katalog 2021 im Vergleich zu den Katalogwerten 2020 um 50% bis 100%. (Abb. 7). Ein gebrauchtes Paar Poonch SG 2 wurde zwischen Herzog Philipp von Ferrari und Tapling gegen eine Mauritius Mint Post Office 2d getauscht. Dieser Tausch erfolgte im späten 19. Jahrhundert durch zwei wirklich sachkundige und leidenschaftliche Sammler ihrer Zeit. Es ist eine Ironie des Schicksals, dass die Mauritius-Briefmarke heute einen Katalogwert von 1,5 Millionen Pfund Sterling hat, während die Poonch-Briefmarke als Einzelstück einen aktuellen Katalogwert von nur 7.500 Pfund Sterling hat. Dies sollte dem Leser eine Vorstellung davon vermitteln, wie unterbewertet die Briefmarken der indischen Feudalstaaten heute sind. Aus diesem Grund

the State boundary or to an overseas destination required British India franking over and above the State franking. The fact that stamps from States such as Dungarpur and Tonk were unknown to the philatelic community for decades after they were issued could be attributed to the fact that no combination covers are known from these two States. Consequently, the world outside the boundaries of these States was unaware of the existence of their stamps.

The world of Indian States philately offers some of the greatest world rarities. Hundreds of rare Indian States stamps, of which less than 20 copies exist, have a typical catalog value of around £2000. It is no wonder that the catalog values of Indian States stamps have seen very steady double-digit appreciation every year for the last 20 years. For example, the catalog values of all unused Dungarpur stamps went up by 50%–100% in the 2021 Stanley Gibbons catalog compared to the 2020 catalogue values. (Fig. 7). A used pair of Poonch SG 2 was exchanged between Duke Phillip von Ferrari and Tapling for a Mauritius Mint Post Office 2d. This exchange happened in the late 19th century by two truly knowledgeable and passionate collectors


of their time. It is ironic to note that while the Mauritius stamp catalogs a whopping £1.5 million today, the Poonch stamp has a current catalog value of only £7500 as singles. This should give readers the idea of how undervalued Indian Feudatory States stamps are today. That is why the catalogue issuing authorities are always trying to play catch-up when it comes to the valuation of Indian Feudatory States.

Immerse yourself in the fascinating world of philately of the Indian Convention and Feudal States and be impressed by the motifs and themes of these 'local stamps'. The step-motherly treatment of these areas in philatelic literature leaves plenty of room for their popularity in the future.

The offering in this special catalogue is the largest of its kind to date and the start of an auction series during the coming years.

A key area in this special catalogue is the stamps and postal history of Barwani. We broke down and offer in hundreds of lots the internationally gold-awarded collection of the great and respected collector Danforth Walker.

Quality

While most collectors are familiar with what is considered as “normal” condition when it comes to Indian Feudatory States philatelic items, the following note is geared to those that may not be. Indian Feudatory States stamps were produced using some of the most primitive printing & perforating methods, often by small local printing firms, soap factories or sometimes by prisoners. Little to no attention was ever paid to paper, margins perforations and separation of stamps and most were issued without gum. So while one may aspire to find perfectly centered mint never hinged copies of stamps produced by security printing firms, such can never be the case when it comes to Indian States stamps & covers and one therefore must lower their expectation when it comes to what is considered “acceptable” quality. The same kind of compromise must be made when considering the quality of covers and cancellation marks. Most were produced under the most primitive conditions and expectations from condition when buying items from this offer must be low. Therefore our descriptions do not include many indications on quality. If more information is required, feel free to send us emails with your requests.

General Conditions for Auction

1. The auction is held exclusively on behalf of and for the account of third parties.
The auctioneer is authorized to pursue in his own name all rights and claims arising from the vendor's instructions or the knocking down of lots.
2. Lots are knocked down to the highest bidder. The auctioneer has the right in justified cases to refuse to knock down a lot, and to withdraw, combine and divide lots. Equal bids are determined by drawing lots. A bidder is bound by his bid if it is followed by a higher bid which is invalid or which is immediately refused by the auctioneer. In case that a higher bid, which was placed in time, erroneously was overlooked or in any other cases of doubt, the auctioneer may cancel the knocking down and reoffer the lot. 4. The auctioneer receives a commission from the buyer of 21% of the hammer price plus EUR 1,50 for each purchased lot. The buyer will be charged with the cost of postage, packing, insurance and the cost of import (in total=expenses) if necessary.
Value added tax (currently 19%) on the auctioneer's commission and expenses together with value added tax on the hammer price (currently 19%) if applicable will be invoiced separately. He commits himself, however, to transmit without delay complaints about defects to the consignor. In case of reversed transaction the auctioneer will reimburse his commission to the buyer; any further claims to him are excluded. Claims relating to obvious defects must be received by the auctioneer within ten days of handing over or delivery. The auctioneer is entitled to require the buyer to obtain at his expense reports from two independent experts that substantiate the claims. With bidding for stamps which have already been expertised or for stamps with certificates the bidder accepts the expert marks and certificates which are available for his guidance and inspection as decisive unless the bid is made subject to certification by any expert nominated by the bidder and approved by the auctioneer before the auction.
Stamps which are clearly established as forgeries may be marked as such by experts.
The auctioneer is entitled to request the buyer to refer all complaints directly to the seller.
9. In addition, we reserve the right to make data on serious service disruptions (e.g. attempted fraud, failure of recognised claims despite two reminders of undisputed or legally enforceable claims) also accessible to third parties if this is in our legitimate interest to prosecute or protect the auction system from damage or if they prove a legitimate interest in this. These may be, for example, criminal prosecution authorities, credit agencies or other auction houses.
10. These auction terms also apply to subsequent sales after auction; the special provisions for distance sales do not apply.
11. Place of fulfillment for either party shall be Wiesbaden; any disputes arising shall be referred to the court having jurisdiction in Wiesbaden under German law.
12. No oral variations to these conditions are valid; all alterations or additions must be in writing.
13. Should one of the above conditions be unworkable in whole or in part, the validity of the other conditions will remain unaffected.

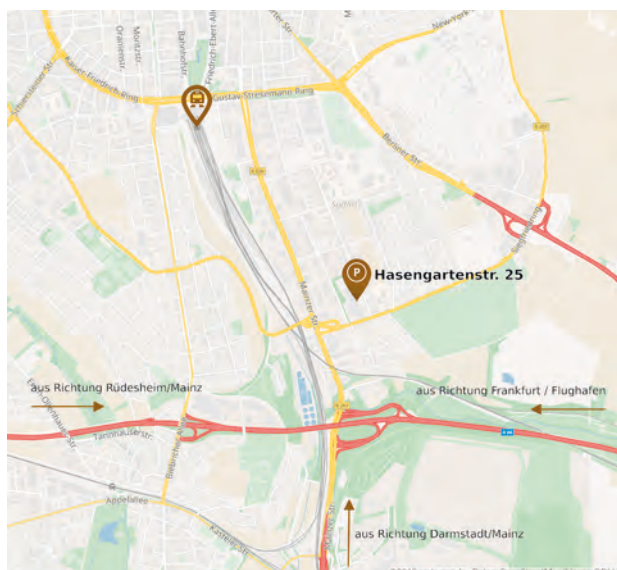

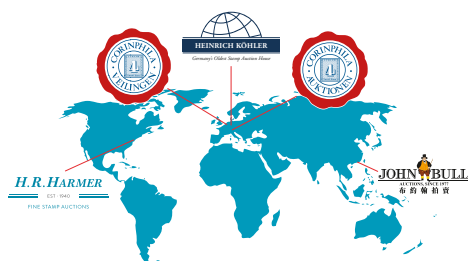
